

**Mathew Maurer, MD** received his BS in biomedical science as part of the seven-year medical school program at the City College of New York Sophie Davis School of Biomedical Education, where he was awarded the Belle Zeller Scholarship. He received his medical degree from Mount Sinai School of Medicine and graduated Alpha Omega Alpha. He completed training in internal medicine and cardiology at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital and was chief medical resident.

A general internist and geriatric cardiologist with advanced training in heart failure and cardiac transplantation, Dr. Maurer has received grants from the National Institute on Aging to study cardiovascular changes in older patients. He specializes in the care of patients with heart failure and a preserved ejection fraction, including patients with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. At Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons, Dr. Maurer directs the Clinical Cardiovascular Research Laboratory for the Elderly (CCRLE) at the Allen Hospital of NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital. Dr. Maurer is also a member of the Advanced Cardiac Care Center at NewYork-Presbyterian/Columbia. He is internationally recognized expert in amyloid cardiomyopathy.
