

Nanette K. Wenger, MD, MACC, MACP, FAHA, is Professor of Medicine (Cardiology) Emeritus for Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia. Dr. Wenger also is Consultant for the Emory Heart and Vascular Center and Founding Consultant for the Emory Women's Heart Center. Dr. Wenger's expertise includes heart disease in women, heart disease in the elderly, cardiac rehabilitation, coronary disease prevention, and contemporary cardiac care. She was honored by the establishment of the J. Willis Hurst, R. Bruce Logue, and Nanette K. Wenger Emory University School of Medicine Trainee Alumni Cardiovascular Society.

A sought-after advisor on coronary heart disease in women and geriatric cardiology, Dr. Wenger chaired the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute Conference on Cardiovascular Health and Disease in Women and the World Health Organization Expert Committee on Rehabilitation After Cardiovascular Disease. She is the Former Chair of the Society for Women's Health Research Board of Directors, and Former Co-chaired of the Guideline Panel on Cardiac Rehabilitation for the United States Agency for Health Care Policy and Research. She is Past President of the Society of Geriatric Cardiology.

Dr. Wenger is the author or coauthor of more than 1600 abstracts, articles, books, and book chapters. Her articles and abstracts are published in peer-reviewed scientific journals, including *Circulation*, *Journal of the American College of Cardiology*, and *Journal of the American Medical Association*. Dr. Wenger also has coauthored clinical practice guidelines for the American College of Cardiology and American Heart Association. She is a member of multiple editorial boards. For more than 15 years, she was Editor in Chief of *American Journal of Geriatric Cardiology*. She is the Review Editor of *Clinical Cardiology*. A gifted speaker, Dr. Wenger has delivered hundreds of local, regional, national, and international presentations in her field.

Dr. Wenger is the recipient of multiple honors and awards, including the American Heart Association Gold Heart Award, American Heart Association Physician of the Year Award, American Heart Association Scientific Councils Distinguished Achievement Award, American Heart Association Women in Cardiology Mentoring Award, American College of Cardiology Inaugural Bernadine Healy Leadership in Women's Cardiovascular Disease Distinguished Award, American College of Cardiology Inaugural Distinguished Mentor Award, American College of Physicians James D. Bruce Memorial Award for Distinguished Contributions in Preventive Medicine, Society of Geriatric Cardiology Distinguished Fellow Award, American Society of Preventive Cardiology Nanette K. Wenger Distinguished Lecture on Cardiovascular Disease Prevention in Women, Atlanta Women in Law and Medicine Shining Star Award, Emory University Williams Distinguished Teaching Award, Emory University School of Medicine Evangeline Papageorge Alumni Teaching Award, Emory University Charles R. Hatcher, Jr, MD, Award for Excellence in Public Health, Hunter College Outstanding Professional Achievement Award, and University College of London and University of Cape Town Hatter Award for Advancement of Cardiovascular Science. A Georgia Woman of the Year, Dr. Wenger has been honored with the American College of Cardiology Georgia Chapter Lifetime Achievement Award and Emory University School of Medicine Alumni Association Arnall Patz Lifetime Achievement Award. She has been included in the National Library of Medicine Exhibition, "Changing the Face of Medicine: A History of American Women Physicians," and she is listed in Castle Connolly's "Best Doctors in America." A luminary in cardiovascular medicine, Dr. Wenger is an elected member of the Emory University First 175 History Makers.
